Future of Jobs Report 2023

The latest 'Future of Jobs Report' of Women Economic Forum (WEF), highlights the significant changes we can expect to see in European labour market. Is it a challenge? Is it an opportunity?

A few findings:

□Almost a quarter (23%) of #jobs are expected to completely change by 2027.

 \Box 6 out of 10 workers will need to reskill or upskill in the next 5 years. \Box #Greentransition will create the strongest net job creation effect. \Box A majority of companies will prioritize #women (79%) and #youth < 25 (68%).

□Adoption of #technology and increased #digital access will create net job growth, with greater offsets from losses.

☐ Fastest-growing jobs relative to their size today are: #AI and #machinelearning specialists, #sustainability specialists, business intelligence analysts and information #security specialists.
